Pain Management	This course is a combination of lecture and participation. Lectures topics include: anatomy and physiology of pain, barriers to pain management, assessment tools, non-drug approaches to pain, and use of analgesics such as non-opioids, opioids, and adjuvant analgesics. Special topics such as pain in the elderly, procedural pain and relieving pain in the context of addiction will be explored.
